# NATIONAL CHARTER SCHOOLS WEEK ACTION KIT

The key to any successful celebration is to create consistent messages, themes and activities that can be planned-for early. We've created a week of activities based on daily themes that your school can rally around. This planning kit is designed to provide maximum exposure to the fact that yours is a unique undertaking. What you do locally affects everyone, and there is strength in numbers, so try to follow the themes set out and select activities that you feel are appropriate.

#### "EDUCATE YOUR COMMUNITY"

Kick-off National Charter Schools Week By Spreading the Word about your Charter!

Do a project or service for a segment of the community.

•

Invite reporters and have them watch classes, or do a live broadcast from your school on the evening news, (consider adding interviews with honored teachers or volunteers).

•

Invite students to write articles about your school to be published in the local paper.

•

Schedule editorial board meetings by having people from your school (board members, administrators, teachers, parents) sit down with the editorial board of your local newspaper and discuss your school's successes, hurdles, future plans, etc.

•

Invite local leaders: mayor, city council, media, school board, business leaders, general public, county commissioners, etc. to give a tour of your school. You may also have a career day where leaders talk to students about their careers or teach a class related to their professions.

•

Announce a new school initiative: new web site, new reading program, etc.

•

Make buttons for people to wear and pass them out around the community.

•

Ask parents, teachers, students, etc. to write letters to members of the community who have helped, i.e. legislators, school boards, banks, foundations, etc.

•

Get together with other charter schools and ask newspapers to sponsor a student essay contest or a special theme relation to education.

•

Send home materials like those in this packet to every parent to help them educate their friends and neighbors.

### "SALUTE OUR TEACHERS"

Have parents and students demonstrate their gratitude for these important folks

Parent group sponsors a breakfast or luncheon for teachers.

•

Hold an Awards Ceremony for Teachers. This could honor a Teacher of the Year, offer other awards for teacher excellence, or be held in conjunction with other charters in the area.

•

Students read essays or perform for honored teachers.

•

Parents/students bring in small treats for teachers.

•

Students interview their teachers and write biographies to be compiled and put in library.

•

Parents and students make a scrapbook about teacher (photos, important items, poems, etc) to be put in library.

•

Special lunch for teacher and his/her class.

•

School awards teacher with small scholarship to attend a conference. You may be able to find a sponsor for this in your community.

•

Parent Association sends cards to each teacher on behalf of the school.

•

Make buttons or hand out stickers!

## "PRIDE IN OUR PARENTS/VOLUNTEERS"

Parents/Volunteers are integral to the success of your charter. If you want their help, show you care!

Serve a special dinner or breakfast for parent volunteers made and served by faculty and students.

•

Students make cards or write thank-yous to volunteers.

•

Display drawings/essays about volunteers & volunteering around school. Place a special notice in your school paper or on the web site recognizing volunteers.

•

Tell students to offer a special thank you to any parent volunteer they see.

•

Design a volunteer appreciation proclamation and send home to every volunteer.

•

Students organize and perform a concert in honor of their parents/volunteers.

## "SHOWCASING OUR STUDENTS"

Hold events that showcase or highlight your students' unique abilities!

Schedule an Awards Ceremony to honor student achievement.

Band/Choir concerts

Make a time capsule, with each class contributing an item

Have a school assembly and include a special entertainer or magician paid for by parents group.

Partner with other charters in the area for a spelling or geography bee, or a trivia contest.

Announce winners of essay contest/art contest/poetry contest, and have student(s) recite his/her winning works to the student body.

Spirit Days (no uniforms, school colors, etc.)

Special Food Treats (school picnic, root beer floats, ice cream sundaes, etc.)

Students get little gift of a bookmark, pencil, etc.

#### "SCHOOL SPIRIT"

Show-off your school and your progress – open your doors to parents, local leaders and citizens

Make this a short (2-3 hour) time period where people can come and see the school in action, including parents – show off the best of your school.

•

Ask mayor for proclamation of CSW and post in public areas.

•

Send invitations to all parents, inviting them to attend your school spirit day.

•

Place an ad in your local newspaper announcing the event.

•

Serve coffee and light snacks at an open house and provide informational brochures for visitors.

•

Arrange to have parents/volunteers lead people around the school.

•

Display student work around school (especially work expressing why the students love their charter school).

•

Pick a theme and let each class decorate their room around that theme.

•

Student performances reflecting the value and importance of school; provide copies of standards, school rules, curriculum, etc.

•

Show videos of student concerts or other events at the school.

•

Have board members on hand as well as teachers and principal to talk with people.

•

Have students create a website for the school; launch at the school spirit day.
